






Lands identified as having high priority for conservation and low-impact public use value (RCW 79.71.020)





DNR Process for Establishing a New Natural Area






Washington's Natural Areas Managed by DNR








Dabob Natural Area Preserve 1984

Dabob Bay Natural Area Expansion 2009




Natural Area Boundary: ~4,000 acres






Dabob Bay Natural Area Expansion 2015




Natural Area Boundary: 4,113 acres





Dabob Bay Natural Area 2016




Natural Area Boundary: 7,750 acres

Trust Land Transfer - Revitalized!

- Established in 1989, Trust Land Transfer (TLT):
 - Transfers economically under-performing state trust lands to a receiving agency,
 - Acquires legislative funding to purchase replacement lands with higher income producing potential; and
 - Conserves lands that have high ecological values and/or other public benefits
- In 2021-2022 DNR worked with beneficiaries, Tribes, stakeholders, and state agencies to revitalize the program
- In 2023, the Legislature passed SHB 1460 to establish the program in statute with improvements developed by DNR and workgroups


Dear Commissioner Franz

Thank you again for your offer to develop collaborative solutions for state forestland management with Jefferson County and your on-going support for the revitalized Trust Land Transfer (TLT) program and Natural Climate Solutions (NCS) funding for forest conservation.

In our letter to you of June 27, 2023 regarding state forestlands in East Jefferson County, one of our requests was that DNR expand the Dabob Bay Natural Resource Conservation Area. This letter is intended as a follow up to specifically request that DNR initiate the process to expand the Dabob Bay Natural Area boundaries as shown on the attached map. The boundary expansion is necessary for DNR to use the TLT and NCS tools in combination to protect Globally Imperiled forest types as well as older, naturally regenerated forests with high ecological significance (aka Legacy Forests). The process will also improve the economic benefits of Forest Trust lands to the county and its junior taxing districts and support the long-term viability of the forest land base and forestry in East Jefferson County.

- County Commissioners requested that DNR expand Dabob Bay Natural Resource Conservation Area.
- The letter noted the expansion will:
 - Allow DNR to use revitalized TLT process
 - Protect more globally-imperiled forest types and structurally-complex, carbon-dense forests.
 - Improve economic benefits of Forested Trust lands to the county and its junior tax districts, through purchase of replacement lands.






