STATEMENT OF ISSUE:

Recently, the City of Port Angeles and the Puget Sound to Pacific Collaborative (PS2P) confirmed that the PS2P RAISE Grant Application, for which Jefferson County was a supporting entity and co-applicant for, was successful.

Representative Derek Kilmer and Senator Patty Murray issued press releases recently announcing the selection by USDOT. Representative Kilmer's quote reflects a lot of what we know PS2P will mean to our communities: "This is a big deal," said Rep. Kilmer. "This investment in the Puget Sound to Pacific network will help connect workers to jobs, local residents to essential services, and folks looking for recreation to some of our region's natural treasures ... That's a huge win for our region."

This is another big win for all of the benefits of improvements to trails for our communities which include health, economic, transportation equity, and conservation of greenways and open spaces.

ANALYSIS:

The PS2P Grant funds all 34 components for all 13 applicants for a total of \$16.13million to be spent by 2032. The proposed components in the application (www.ps2p.org) are included in the summary attached here. The federal grant will fund planning and design for 100 miles of trail projects and safety improvements along the western end of the Great American Rail-Trail from Bainbridge Island to LaPush, as well as network connections between Port Townsend and Kingston, and to residential and business areas and transit.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Of the \$16.13 million total, \$2.88million comes to Jefferson County jurisdictions – including the county, Port of Port Townsend, and City of Port Townsend - for planning and design for trail projects and safety improvements in Jefferson County.

On behalf of Jefferson County, a co-applicant, please accept this letter of support for the Puget Sound to Pacific FY23 RAISE application, to plan the Great American Rail-Trail from Bainbridge Island across the Olympic Peninsula to La Push.

As a Co-Applicant Jefferson County embraces the benefits active transportation infrastructure provides to our communities. Trails transform communities by providing equitable access, enhancing safety, quality of life, sustainability, and by bolstering local economies. We value the health benefits derived from active transportation.

Jefferson County has joined this application because the PS2P projects will create an innovative active transportation and recreation corridor, providing a safe, non-motorized shared use path through this beautiful and productive rural landscape. This multi-use trail project will be an asset not just to the three counties, numerous small towns and several Indian Reservations directly impacted, but also to the wider state of Washington.

A key component of the PS2P, the Olympic Discovery Trail, is planned to run 130 miles from Port Townsend, our county seat, to the Pacific Ocean at La Push and is 61 percent complete. Currently the county is working on a key extension of the trail running from the trailhead at the Jefferson Transit Authority at Four Corners through Rayonier Timber lands to Anderson Lake State Park. Building this segment will allow trail users to reach the state park on 10 miles of trail, with only one-third mile of non-trail travel. This new section will be an exciting addition to the PS2P corridor. Our long-term land use, transportation, and capital improvement plans include significant commitments to implementing PS2P projects, community connections and transit support for active transportation.

Please support this PS2P RAISE grant and support this important project to provide the public health, recreation, community development, and transportation benefits of trails to Olympic Peninsula communities and beyond.
